The Value and Benefits of becoming an Assessor / Mentor

- Individuals trained will become a UKPHR Assessor.
- Be part of a community of Assessors and Mentors supporting the development of a key public health workforce.
- Contribute to the development of public health careers for individuals.
- Gain a wider understanding of public health practice taking place across the Thames Valley.

The Training

This training will be delivered in partnership with the UKPHR and Health Education England Thames Valley.

Assessor – 1.5 days training over 2 days

Mentor – 2 days, you will need to complete the Assessor training and a half day of Mentor training which is during the afternoon of Day 2.

The training will provide participants with an:

- Understanding of the Thames Valley Public Health Practitioner Scheme.
- Understanding of the Assessors' role and the assessment process.

Eligibility Criteria

- To have at least two years' experience at senior or advanced practitioner level in multi-disciplinary public health **OR**
- To be an existing registered public health practitioner with the UKPHR.
